Bible Q & A

This question was recently submitted by one of our Bible correspondence students.

QUESTION:

"Is it okay to read some of these other gospels on the internet that were not put in the Bible like Maccabees, Apocalypse of James, Gospel of Judas, etc.?"

ANSWER:

There are two major categories of writings that are sometimes identified as lost books of the Bible. I will use the terms Old Testament Apocrypha and New The Testament Apocrypha. "apocrypha" means "hidden". Some of these books have been hidden from history for long periods of time. Nearly all have a hidden or obscure origin. We have no idea who wrote them, in spite of some bold claims from the writings themselves. None of them are inspired, nor should they be held at the same level as the Bible, any more than other human writings.

Old Testament Apocrypha

Old Testament Apocrypha includes Jewish literature from the time between the Old and New Testaments. Among these books are 1st & 2nd Maccabees, which tell the history of the Jews during that time, additions to the books of Esther and Daniel, collections of proverbial wisdom statements and writings, and religious fiction. None of these writings are inspired, but the historical writings are very useful in understanding the events of that time period, many of which were in fulfillment of prophecy. The other writings can be interesting to read and not harmful or dangerous as long as their claims to be written by Bible characters such as Manasseh, Baruch, Daniel, Ezra or Solomon are not taken seriously.

The Catholic Church in the 1500s insisted that the Old Testament apocrypha had the same level of authority as the rest of the Old Testament. But these are Jewish writings, and the Jews themselves never considered these books to be inspired or authoritative.

New Testament Apocrypha

The New Testament Apocrypha includes writings from the 2nd-4th centuries after Christ. There are many of these, most of which claim to have been written by one of the apostles or other early Christians, and which were either unknown to the early church or rejected by them as spurious. Whereas the authors of the Old Testament apocrypha, even when writing fiction, wrote within the literary, religious and moral tradition of Judaism, many of the New Testament apocrypha were active attempts to put the teachings of various sects and heretics in the mouths of Jesus and His apostles. As such, the writers of these documents were in direct attacks engaged Christianity, seeking to subvert it, usually in an attempt to import into Christianity the Gnostic philosophies of the Greeks and other pagans.

In our time, the existence of these documents has been used in attempts to undermine the authority of the Scriptures. Those who promote them do so, not

because they believe their contents (the Gnostic teachings are very outlandish and the morals of the Gnostics were in many cases repulsive and decadent!) but rather because they seek to undermine the faith of Christians in the New Testament. In trying to offer these writings as somehow equal to the writings of the New Testament, they overlook or brush aside the fact that we have thousands of early copies of nearly every part of the New Testament in the original language, whereas most of these apocryphal writings are supported only by one or two extremely incomplete documents dating from several centuries after the time of Christ that are not in Greek but usually in Coptic or some other language that was unknown to the writers of the New Testament.

To sum up, the Old Testament apocrypha can be read with profit by careful Bible students just as they might read other works of men, such as devotional writings or religious fiction, or historical works related to Bible times. The New Testament apocrypha should be handled with extreme caution, if at all, by

mature Christians who are on guard against the original false teachings they will find there and the use currently being made of them to undermine Christian faith.

Are there any lost books of the Bible? No, and we have God's word for it:

1 Peter 1:22-25 NKJV "Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart, 23 having been born again, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever, because 'ALL FLESH IS AS GRASS, AND ALL THE GLORY OF MAN AS THE FLOWER OF THE GRASS. THE GRASS WITHERS, AND ITS FLOWER FALLS AWAY. 25 BUT THE WORD OF THE LORD ENDURES FOREVER.' Now this is the word which by the gospel was preached to you."
