 - d. Since His is my sustainer, I should obey His voice
- V. He is our Judge
 - a. Eccl. 12:13-14
 - b. 2 Cor. 5:9-10
 - c. Acts 17:30-31
 - d. Since His is my judge, I should obey His voice
- VI. He is our Redeemer
 - a. Ex. 6:5-6 – Redeemer of Israel
 - b. Gal. 4:4-7 – Sent a Redeemer for the whole world
 - c. We can be his children

- d. Since He is my Redeemer, I should obey His voice

 - a. Heb 12:9
 - b. Matt 7:11
