



# THE LORD'S SUPPER

---

Luke 22:1-23

## Luke 22:1–6 (ESV)

**1** Now the Feast of Unleavened Bread drew near, which is called the Passover. **2** And the chief priests and the scribes were seeking how to put him to death, for they feared the people. **3** Then Satan entered into Judas called Iscariot, who was of the number of the twelve. **4** He went away and conferred with the chief priests and officers how he might betray him to them. **5** And they were glad, and agreed to give him money. **6** So he consented and sought an opportunity to betray him to them in the absence of a crowd.

## Luke 22:7–13 (ESV)

**7** Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. **8** So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, “Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat it.” **9** They said to him, “Where will you have us prepare it?” **10** He said to them, “Behold, when you have entered the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him into the house that he enters **11** and tell the master of the house, ‘The Teacher says to you, Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?’ **12** And he will show you a large upper room furnished; prepare it there.” **13** And they went and found it just as he had told them, and they prepared the Passover.

## Luke 22:14–18 (ESV)

**14** And when the hour came, he reclined at table, and the apostles with him. **15** And he said to them, “I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. **16** For I tell you I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.” **17** And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he said, “Take this, and divide it among yourselves. **18** For I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.”

## Luke 22:19–20 (ESV)

**19** And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, “This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” **20** And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, “This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.”

## Matthew 26:28 (ESV)

**28** for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.

## Exodus 24:4–8 (ESV)

**4** And Moses wrote down all the words of the LORD. He rose early in the morning and built an altar at the foot of the mountain, and twelve pillars, according to the twelve tribes of Israel. **5** And he sent young men of the people of Israel, who offered burnt offerings and sacrificed peace offerings of oxen to the LORD. **6** And Moses took half of the blood and put it in basins, and half of the blood he threw against the altar. **7** Then he took the Book of the Covenant and read it in the hearing of the people. And they said, “All that the LORD has spoken we will do, and we will be obedient.” **8** And Moses took the blood and threw it on the people and said, “**Behold the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you** in accordance with all these words.”

# The Fruit of the Vine

**Luke 22:20** - And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, “This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.”

**Matt. 26:28** - for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.

## Luke 22:21–23 (ESV)

**21** But behold, the hand of him who betrays me is with me on the table. **22** For the Son of Man goes as it has been determined, but woe to that man by whom he is betrayed!” **23** And they began to question one another, which of them it could be who was going to do this.

## Luke 22:19–20 (ESV)

**19** And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, “This is my body, which is given for you. **Do this in remembrance of me.**” **20** And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, “This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.”

## Acts 20:7 (ESV)

7 On the first day of the week, when we were gathered together to break bread, Paul talked with them, intending to depart on the next day, and he prolonged his speech until midnight.

# 1 Corinthians 11:23–26 (ESV)

**23** For I received from the Lord what I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, **24** and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, “This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” **25** In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.” **26** For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.

# 1 Corinthians 11:27–30 (ESV)

**27** Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord. **28** Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. **29** For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself. **30** That is why many of you are weak and ill, and some have died.

## Hebrews 9:18–23 (ESV)

**18** Therefore not even the first covenant was inaugurated without blood. **19** For when every commandment of the law had been declared by Moses to all the people, he took the blood of calves and goats, with water and scarlet wool and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book itself and all the people, **20** saying, “This is the blood of the covenant that God commanded for you

## Hebrews 9:18–23 (ESV)

**21** And in the same way he sprinkled with the blood both the tent and all the vessels used in worship. **22** Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins. **23** Thus it was necessary for the copies of the heavenly things to be purified with these rites, but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these.

## Hebrews 10:19–25 (ESV)

**19** Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, **20** by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, **21** and since we have a great priest over the house of God, **22** let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.

## Hebrews 10:19–25 (ESV)

**23** Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. **24** And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, **25** not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.
